She is currently vice Dean of community , Benha College of Medicine , Benha University , EGYPT and a consultant of International Affairs and visiting professor at Ras Al Khaima College of Medicine ,UAE. She is the founding President of Emirates Menopause Society,UAE.

Her interest in medical education began in the early 2000s when she was invited to be part of the founders and curriculum development task force responsible for implementing a problem based learning curriculum (College of Medicine, University of Sharjah UAE). After several years serving as a Head of Basic Medical Sciences Department at College of Medicine Sharjah University , she was offered a post in medical education as a Head of Academic Coordination Sector and Integrated curriculum at Armed Forces College of Medicine, Egypt where she is largely involved in the integrated curriculum and problem based learning (PBL) for the pre-clerkship and clerkship phases of the medical school.

She has established a track record of quality research outputs.
